With two children who are not fully toilet trained, it is ever more important to provide a nurturing environment that allows the children to flourish. Our spending in this area is to tackle pupils' wellbeing and self-esteem, ensuring that pupils are happy and engaged in school so that learning can take place and, as a result, an impact had on standards of attainment. Language and literacy provides us with the building blocks for accessing the curriculum, building successful lives and entering the world of work. The EEF has identified that a range of approaches works best and that oral interventions, phonics and reading comprehension strategies have an impact that is relatively low cost and on average, pupils who participate in these interventions make approximately five months' additional progress over the course of the year. This focus area will focus on ensuring that FSM children are supported in being able to access language and close the gap with their peers. Mathematical understanding helps children make sense of the world around them, interpret situations, and solve problems in everyday life, whether that's understanding time, sharing amounts with their peers, or counting in play.
