Research by the EFF has identified that gaps between more affluent children and their peers emerge before the age of 5 and so a strong foundation in Early Years is essential. Before formal teaching can begin, the focus of our full time Nursery provision focuses on play-based learning, developing communication skills and supporting parents with encouraging learning at home. With two children who are not fully toilet trained, it is ever more important to provide a nurturing environment that allows the children to flourish. The funding in this area will be used to provide as additional adult in the Nursery and Reception provision, so that

As a school we recognise that tackling pupil's social and emotional learning is central to what we do within the school, if we want pupils to fully engage in their education. The EFF highlight that tackling self-esteem and Well-being has a big impact on the attainment of pupils and we recognise that pupil's eligible for PDG funding, very often bring with them issues around Well-being and self-esteem. Our spending in this area is to tackle pupils' wellbeing and self-esteem, ensuring that pupils are happy and engaged in school so that learning can take place and, as a result, an impact had on standards of attainment. Language and literacy provides us with the building blocks for accessing the curriculum, building successful lives and entering the world of work. The EEF has identified that a range of approaches works best and that oral interventions, phonics and reading comprehension strategies have an impact that is relatively low cost and on average, pupils who participate in these interventions make approximately five months' additional progress over the course of the year. This focus area will focus on ensuring that FSM children are supported in being able to access language and close the gap with their peers. Mathematical understanding helps children make sense of the world around them, interpret situations, and solve problems in everyday life, whether that's understanding time, sharing amounts with their peers, or counting in play.
